Bicycle Give Away Program

Passports: At both events, attendees are given a passport. To enter the raffle for a free bicycle, attendees must visit all booths and receive a stamp. At the end of the event, a raffle will be held for the distribution of free bicycles which also included bicycle safety kits, helmets, and education material.

Purchase 40 bicycles, 100 helmets and safety kits.

The following number of bicycles, safety helmets and bicycle safety kits were purchased. The bicycle safety kits include information on bicycle safety, Bicycle Repair Bag & Bicycle Tire Pump, Home Bike Tool Portable Patches Fixes, Inflator, Bike Chain and Essential Tool Bag Repair tool Kit Safety Emergency.

- 110 Safety Helmets Purchased
- 158 Bicycle Safety Kits

PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED

The COVID-19 pandemic was the only problem the city encountered implementing the Bicycle Education Program. A major byproduct of the pandemic on manufactures has been the disruption to production and supply chains, affecting the purchase and delivery of bicycles. In addition to the issues surrounding production, physical and social distancing made it impossible to implement the program during all of 2020 and parts of 2021.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

The Cathedral City Bicycle Education Program was a huge success as more people throughout our community are currently using this active mode of transportation while learning about the responsibilities of bicycle safety and putting that knowledge into action. It is through programs like these that make a difference in the lives of our residents, reduce their carbon footprints, and help protect our fragile climate. On the periphery, nothing is more rewarding than seeing the smiles on the faces of children when they get that first glimpse of their new bicycle, take that first ride, and show pride in their new ownership. And for many adults, it is a rekindling of the feeling you had when you rode your first bike and the freedom of movement it offers. For others, it is about getting exercise and feeling healthier in the quest of reaching a destination, whether that be for work, shopping, or home. Regardless of the multitude of reasons, the Cathedral City Bicycle

Education Program has made a significant impact on so many residents and it is the Cathedral City's hope that this program will continue for the next generation of bicyclists.





It's Easy

Use any type of bike, wear any clothes, ride any distance at your own pace. Once a month, once a week, every day as often as you want.

It's Healthy

Bicycling on your way to work or to do errands is a great way to get your daily exercise.

It's Convenient

On a bike, you don't have to worry about getting stuck in traffic jams or where to park.

It Saves Money

No car insurance, no gas, no fees – bicyclists can save thousands of dollars a year.

It's Green

Bicycles don't pollute. It's that easy.

And it's Fun!

There's a simple reason why so many people are bicycling: they love it. Give it a try! You'll find out that bicycling is right for you.

Your Bike

Any bike will do the job; what's important is finding one that fits. If your bike isn't comfortable, you won't use it. If you buy a used bike or pull the old one out of the basement, make sure to get it checked out at a bike shop before you take it on the road.

What You'll Need

Strongly recommended:

- A helmet that fits correctly (required if 16 or younger).
- A good, solid lock.
- If you ride when it's dark, you need to be visible. Bikes are required to have a front white light, a rear red reflector or light, reflectors (or reflective clothing) visible from the sides, and pedal (or ankle) reflectors at night.
- A good knowledge of bicycle safety rules.

Nice to have:

- A small toolkit with basic wrenches for your bike, a patch kit or spare tube, tire levers, and a pump.
- Biking gloves to protect your hands.
- A bell.
- Weather-specific clothing.

Getting Around

Choose a route that feels safe and comfortable to you. The shortest route isn't always the best. You may need alternate routes for cold or wet days.

You need to also get to know the rules of the road for bicyclists. Check out the following website for helpful tips: <https://one.nhtsa.gov/people/injury/pedbimot/bike/kidsandbikesafetyweb/index.htm>.

When you arrive at your destination, make sure you lock up! Put a U-lock through the front wheel frame, and the bike rack. There are bike racks at all public parks and facilities.

Tu Bicicleta

Cualquier bicicleta sirve; lo importante es encontrar una que se adapte a ti. Si tu bicicleta no es cómoda, no la usarás. Si compras una bicicleta de segunda mano o sacas la vieja del sótano, asegúrate de que la revisen en una tienda de bicicletas antes de ponerla en marcha.

Qué Necesitarás

Muy recomendable:

- Un casco que se ajuste correctamente (obligatorio si tienes 16 años o menos).
- Un buen candado sólido.
- Si conduces cuando está oscuro, tienes que ser visible. Las bicicletas están obligadas a llevar una luz blanca delantera, un reflector o luz roja trasera, reflectores (o ropa reflectante) visibles desde los lados, y reflectores en los pedales (o en los tobillos) por la noche.
- Un buen conocimiento de las normas de seguridad de la bicicleta.

Es bueno tener:


- Un pequeño estuche de herramientas con llaves básicas para la bicicleta, un paquete de parches o una cámara de repuesto, palancas para neumáticos y una bomba.
- Guantes de ciclista para proteger las manos.
- Un timbre.
- Ropa específica para el clima.

Cómo Desplazarte

Elige una ruta que te resulte segura y cómoda. La ruta más corta no siempre es la mejor. Puede que necesites rutas alternativas para los días fríos o húmedos.

What Kids Can Do About Climate Change

What is Climate Change?

Climate change, also called global warming, is the process of the Earth's climate gradually getting warmer. In addition to the Earth warming, rainfall patterns are changing, sea level is rising, and snow and ice are melting sooner in the spring - which reduces California's water supply. As global temperatures continue to rise, we'll see more changes in our climate and our environment. Many of these changes will cause problems for people, animals, and ecosystems.

What is Causing Global Warming?

Scientists believe that the release of greenhouse gases by human-related activities such as burning fossil fuels, like oil (which is used to make gasoline and diesel) and coal (mainly used to make electricity), is causing most of the warming. Another cause is cutting down forests, since trees soak up carbon dioxide, one of the greenhouse gases in the air.

How is it Climate Change Affecting Us?

In addition to warmer temperatures around the world, some places will get less rain and snow, which can mean too little water. Some places will get more rain, which can cause flooding. More hot days can hurt crops and make people and animals sick. The negative effects of global climate change will be less serious overall if people reduce the amount of greenhouse gases we're putting into the air.

What is California Doing?

The State of California has passed laws and set up programs to reduce greenhouse gases which cause climate change. California is getting more energy from renewable sources, like wind and solar (from the sun) that don't pollute the environment and don't release greenhouse gases. California is also encouraging more energy efficient cars and homes, which also reduces greenhouse gases. However, California can't do it alone. People and governments around the world must also work hard to reduce greenhouse gases to eventually help stabilize the climate.

What Can Kids Do?

You don't have to wait until you are fully grown to do something about climate change. Think about the things you do each day that use energy, like electricity used in your house for lights, refrigerators and computers. Every time you ride in your car, it uses energy (gasoline for most cars). By finding ways to cut back on energy use you will reduce greenhouse gases. Below are some easy things you can do to help the environment and lower the release of greenhouse gases.

- When not in use or leaving a room, turn off the lights.
- Whenever possible, recycle things like cans, bottles and paper.
- Bike or walk short distances instead of asking for a ride in a car.
- Tell grownups at your home that you would like to do more to save energy and help climate change, so your family may help with these efforts too. Everyone's contributions will help!




